ABSTRACT

This study wants to analyze how the representation of discrimination on Zootopia film especially scenes and dialogues that characterize representation of discrimination

Based on the analysis it can be concluded that there are 4 representations of discrimination in the initial flow in Zootopia film, 4 representations of discrimination on the middle groove on Zootopia film and 3 representations of discrimination on the final flow in Zootopia film. In addition there are 11 scenes that represent discrimination and 6 types of direct discrimination contained in Zootopia film and 5 types of indirect discrimination contained in Zootopia film.
