ABSTRACT

One function and role of the press is social control. The same was done by the Student Press Organisation (LPM) of the State Islamic University Sunan Gunung Djati (UIN SGD) Bandung through a published journalistic product, the Suaka Magazine. This study aims to find the investigative reporting steps carried by Suaka LPM in covering the main report of Suaka Magazine, specifically in the edition of "Invisible Intervention", referring to one of investigative reporting models presented by Paul Williams. This research was conducted using qualitative methods with a qualitative descriptive approach. The results of this study show that Suaka LPM applied Paul Williams's investigative reportage concept even though it was not one hundred percent the same. This can be seen from the modification that was adjusted to the condition of Suaka LPM.
