ABSTRACT

Indonesia is a unitary country that has a variety of cultures and arts, but there

are not many art workers in Indonesia who have a welfare. One of them is Mimi

Tumus, a last dancer from the Tari Topeng Cirebon Keyo-style. In 1993 Mimi Tumus

stopped dancing Topeng Kreyo because of his disappointment at the government's lack

of attention towards art workers, then he had to do a life struggle because there was no

income other than dancing. The story of Mimi Tumus's life struggle was presented in

the "Pesona Indonesia" program TVRI West Java episode "Kembalinya Maestro

Topeng Kreyo". The struggle of life in this episode lies in the hard work of Mimi

Tumus to fulfill his daily life since he stopped dancing, until finally he is at the turning

point of his dancing again. Researchers used qualitative methods and John Fiske's

semiotic methods in reality level (appearance, dress, make up, environment,

behaviour, speech, gesture, expression), representation level (camera, sound, lighting,

editing), and ideology level. From the results of this study it can be concluded that the

meaning of the struggle of Mimi Tumus is illustrated in this program by John Fiske's

semiotic codes through codes of reality and representation. Whereas the ideological

code uses materialism ideology, seen in Mimi Tumus who turned into a masseuse and

sells boiled peanuts and traveling boiled corn to meet his material needs.
