ABSTRACT

INTERIOR REDESIGN OF SRI BADUGA MUSEUM

Based on data from Bandung City Tourism visits from the official website of the West Java provincial government in 2018, Bandung City became one of the cities with the highest tourist visits. Based on measurements made by Frontier Consulting Group and Tempo Media Group, the Bandung City tourism index is one of the highest in Indonesia, which reached 95.30 or higher than the city of Denpasar with a Tourism Index of 87.65 and the City of Yogyakarta with a Tourism index of 85.68. With this increase, tourism facilities in the city of Bandung need to be optimized in accordance with the contents of the Law of the Republic of Indonesia Number 10 of 2009 concerning tourism, which reads "that the state of nature, flora and fauna as a gift from God Almighty.
