

ABSTRACT

The Central Sulawesi Museum is a Central Sulawesi provincial museum located in Palu City, Central Sulawesi. Located on Jl. Kemiri No. 23. The establishment of the Central Sulawesi Museum began with the results of an assessment conducted by one of the Central Sulawesi humanists, Masyhuudin Masyhuda BA. His idea to establish a museum was outlined in an article entitled "Perspectives on the Development of the State Museum of Central Sulawesi Province" which was presented at the museum science course at the National Museum in 1975.

The specific collections of the museum are related to the history and culture of the province of Central Sulawesi itself, Donggala Woven Cloth, traditional clothing from all districts and cities in Central Sulawesi, replicas of the Palindo Statue which depicts the ancestors of the Bada people, and Taingaja which is a statue a buffalo head made of bronze is part of the collection of the Central Sulawesi Museum which is closely related to the province of Central Sulawesi itself
