

ABSTRACT

Public libraries in Indonesia are divided into national libraries, provincial public libraries, region/city public libraries, and village libraries. One of the public libraries in Jambi Province is the Jambi City Public Library. Each library has service standards, both national and international standards. Based on a comparison between the conditions of the Jambi City Public Library and public library service standards, the Jambi City Public Library has not met the standards in several aspects, including; Implementation of room layouts that are not yet optimal; design features on the interior of the library are incomplete; and the sign-system to make it easier for users to access the library has not been well organized.

The success or failure of the Jambi City Public Library in solving all existing problems can be measured from the indicators contained in the Jambi City Public Library strategic planning. These indicators can be achieved by redesigning the interior. The redesign principle used is Universal Design and is guided by district/city library standards in Indonesia. These principles consist of equitable use, flexibility in use. Simple and intuitive use, perceptible information, tolerance for error, low physical effort, size and space for approach and use. The application of the universal design concept in this design can be seen from the simple forms of furniture that can be used by all groups, interior elements that are interactive for users, room sizes and furniture that are in accordance with ergonomics, and the layout system that is implemented by looking at the function of the room and its users.
