NEW DESIGN OF INTERIOR DAGO ART SPACE IN BANDUNG WITH

According to data released by the Culture and Tourism Office of West Java Province, in 2020 there are at least 721 art communities/art studios/art pavilions that have been registered for legality and there are 1,165 art actors in various fields of art. The government as well as artists and communities have also established an Art space that is a gathering place to exchange ideas, build connections to be able to display their work in front of the public. But unfortunately, with so many communities/art studios in the city of Bandung, it does not guarantee that the infrastructure used by the community is good and in accordance with the activities they can do. This problem was known through interviews and observations with several art communities around Dago. Therefore, Dago Art Space is designed to be able to support the development of art and creativity that arises from activities that are of interest to the people of Bandung City, as well as a place to build a network of relationships and interactions between Indonesian art actors.
