## **ABSTRACT**

Literacy interest in the Lebak district is still relatively low, and there have been several efforts made by relevant authorities to enhance literacy interest in the Lebak district. One of these efforts is the integration of the Saidja Adinda library with the Multatuli Museum, located in the city of Rangkasbitung. However, this is not sufficient as it is only located in the city center and is difficult to access for people residing far from Rangkasbitung. Currently, the Lebak district in Banten Province lacks facilities and infrastructure such as reading parks, libraries, and others. The design of literacy facilities, aimed at increasing reading interest and supporting student productivity in the Lebak district, Banten Province, is one of the proposed design ideas to facilitate and stimulate public interest in recognizing the importance of reading and to facilitate student productivity activities. This design utilizes a qualitative research method, with data collection techniques involving observations and interviews with potential users and relevant authorities. The design approach employed is the User-Centered Design (UCD) method. Through this design, it has been determined that the literacy facility design will take the form of shelters in the Lebak district, Banten Province.
