The La Galigo Museum is a building located in the Fort Rotterdam area and is included in the category of heritage Dutch colonial heritage buildings which were converted by the South Sulawesi Provincial government. The condition of the museum building is poorly maintained due to minimal lighting and materials that are still from the Dutch colonial era with high humidity in the room triggering a scary perception for the public. So it takes an experience of space and interesting activities.
