ABSTRACT

The role of the family in child development is very important because the family is the first social group in every human being's life. The results of this study are that the communication patterns of children and parents who have a helicopter parenting pattern have limitations, causing children to choose to be more open with others. There should be openness, empathy, and mutual support in children and parents so that both children and parents are at an equal point in communicating without any feelings of not being heard for both parties, resulting in effective communication in a family.
