

ABSTRACT

This study examines the significance of information technology in the growth of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in Indonesia, with a focus on financial report management.

For the purpose of recording income and expenses, many MSME operators still use outdated techniques, which can result in financial reports that are inaccurate.

Interviews with MSME actors at SMK Daarut Tauhiid revealed that the primary obstacle is the incapacity to effectively handle financial reports.

In order to make it easier to record income and expenses and to automatically generate financial reports, this research suggests creating a cash management application.

The SDLC waterfall model, which incorporates requirements analysis, design, implementation, testing, and maintenance, is the development methodology employed.
