**ABSTRACT** 

Intercultural communication competence is an important factor in the adaptation

process of migrants, especially for people from the Bugis tribe who are migrating to

Kupang, East Nusa Tenggara. Differences in culture, language, and communication

styles are often a challenge in interacting. This study aims to analyze the role of

intercultural communication competence in the adaptation process of Bugis people

using a qualitative case study approach. Data were collected through in-depth

interviews with Bugis people who live in Kupang, East Nusa Tenggara.

The results illustrate that the three main components of intercultural

communication competence, namely, attitudes, knowledge, and skills play a role in the

adaptation process. The attitude of openness to new cultures, understanding of

cultural differences, and skills in adjusting communication styles are the main things

in successful adaptation.
