

ABSTRAC

This final project report presents the interior design process for PT. Qudo Buana Nawakara's office, located within a commercial unit at Hquarters Business Residence, Bandung. The design adopts a Japandi Industrial concept—an aesthetic blend of Japanese minimalism and Scandinavian warmth, enriched with industrial elements such as exposed concrete and unfinished materials. Occupying an area of approximately 60 m², the project emphasizes spatial efficiency, comfort, aesthetics, and corporate identity.

As part of the MBKM internship program at PT. Koloni Tri Arsitama, the author served as a Project Supervisor, actively engaging in every stage of the project, including needs assessment, site surveys, design supervision, and final evaluation. One of the main challenges faced during the project was space limitation and strict building regulations, which were addressed through strategic planning and the use of multifunctional furniture.

The office layout was designed not only to support daily work activities but also to include a private rest area for the manager and a compact pantry as supporting facilities. The Japandi Industrial approach was chosen to create a calm, warm, yet professional workspace atmosphere. This report not only documents the office design process but also reflects the author's hands-on learning experience within a real-world professional interior design setting.
