ABSTRACT

This study aims to examine the relationship between family communication patterns and parenting styles among adolescents at SMAIT Bina Bangsa Sejahtera Bogor. This research employed a quantitative method with a survey approach, involving 344 respondents selected using a simple random sampling technique. The research instrument measured two dimensions of family communication patterns, namely conversation orientation and conformity orientation, as well as four types of parenting styles based on Baumrind's theory. The results of the Pearson correlation analysis revealed a significant positive relationship between family communication patterns and parenting styles, with a correlation coefficient (r) of 0.457 and a significance value of p < 0.001. These findings indicate that family communication patterns play an essential role in shaping the parenting tendencies applied by parents to adolescents.
