The strategies employed focus on optimizing natural daylight, enhancing airflow through natural ventilation, incorporating greenery, using eco-friendly materials, and managing acoustics effectively. Eventually, the project aims to deliver a co-living hotel that not only fulfills practical requirements but also promotes the physical and mental well-being of its occupants, serving as a benchmark for sustainable hospitality in support of Bali's burgeoning tourism industry.
