ABSTRACT

The background of this research is based on the need for modern, space-saving room furniture, especially for boarding house residents with limited room sizes. One case study of particular interest is BumiKiara, a student boarding house located near Telkom University. This study aims to design a combination of a study desk and dressing table that can optimize space usage in small boarding rooms. The proposed design includes a mirror, storage drawers, a small lamp, and a knockdown (disassemblable) system to enhance flexibility and efficiency. The research uses a qualitative-descriptive approach, with data collected through observation, interviews, and documentation. The main material chosen is plywood due to its lightweight, durability, and ecofriendly properties. This research contributes to the development of innovative, sustainable, and multifunctional furniture that meets the needs of urban communities. The results are expected to serve as a reference for future furniture design development for small spaces.
